

# WHY WELL-CONNECTED ARTIST NANCY CADOGAN'S NEW EXHIBITION IS A MUST SEE

Nancy Cadogan, previously described by Tatler as 'the new Paula Rego' will feature in an exhibition that has just opened at the Lyndsey Ingram Gallery in Mayfair. The new 'Wall of Small' will be a celebration of the smaller, finer things. All things 'small yet perfectly formed' – it showcases Nancy's bright and observed style at its very best. Paintings that Lyndsey Ingram, the director of the gallery, describes as 'true gems'.

Nancy will be exhibited alongside contemporary bigwigs David Hockney, outspoken potter, Grayson Perry (who she is pictured with below) and Royal Academician Cornelia Parker. The paintings are bursts of exuberant colour, a true uplift for any wall.

Nancy's contributions to the 'Wall of Small' are called Tea Rituals – a teapot and cup set against an evocative apricot orange backdrop.

Cadogan explains, 'I am interested in the intersection between inanimate objects, which having often been made by the human hand become full of meaning and a way of connection.' She adds: 'the ancient tradition of tea ceremonies is a fascinating aspect of the Eastern culture'.

Cadogan, born in 1979, is a British-American artist based in Northamptonshire although her work takes her across continents. Last year, she put on a blockbuster exhibition at the Saatchi entitled Mind Zero which sold out in absolute, perhaps it's the tantalising, transportive use of colour or maybe the fact that her great friend, the global fashion success story, Claudia Schiffer popped along?
